## Happy 50th Birthday!

The first Fremont library was established in 1922. In 1927, the library was moved to the high school and became a school-public library. Beginning in 1929, non-residents were able to check out books for an annual fee of \$1.00.

The Fremont Public Library Foundation, dedicated to the task of securing a modern public library for Fremont, was established in July 1963. Mr. and Mrs. Dan Gerber, Sr. donated \$50,000 and the community raised the remaining \$100,000 needed to purchase and remodel a former bank building into a library. Elizabeth Hutchins was hired as librarian and the Fremont Public Library opened its doors in 1964.

By 1982 the library had outgrown the former bank building, and a new library building was built at the current location. By 1995, it became clear that the community had outgrown that building and planning began to expand the facility. In 2001, the library moved into an expanded and renovated building that includes a local history room, children's programming room, a young adult area, and quiet study rooms.

In July 1996 the Fremont Public Library transformed from a city department into the Fremont Area District Library, serving the entirety of the Fremont Public School district.

Although many things have changed over the years, one thing has remained constant: the desire to meet the informational, educational, and entertainment needs of the public. The library is excited to celebrate the 50th birthday of the Fremont Public Library and to continue providing the legacy of high quality library service that began in 1922!





# Summer Reading 2014 Wrap-up





In this year's summer reading program, adults were encouraged to explore "Literary Elements;" ninety-three patrons accepted the challenge! Of those, 70 people read at least 4 books and received coupons for a free ice cream cone at the Koffee Kuppe; 48 people completed the program and were eligible for the final prize drawing. Ellen Cappadonia was the 1st prize winner of a beautiful hand-made quilted throw and a \$25 Barnes & Noble gift card. Jessica Scott won 2nd prize – a \$20 B&N gift card, and Joan Klanderud won a Demco canvas book bag.

Eighty-eight teens spent their summer "Spark(ing) a Reaction," joining us for some great craft and entertainment programs; and, of course, reading. Each teen set their own reading goal and chose the amount of time that each square on their reading log was worth. More than fifty participants completed, or partially completed, their reading logs. Prize winners this year were: Marinda B. - \$50 Visa gift card; Jaimie K. – 32 G flash drive; and Rachel K. – a summer fun pack.

Our young people had an eventful summer as well with over 2,200 people attending 31 programs! As part of our "Fizz, Boom, Read" activities, we were visited by animals from around the corner and around the world. We heard stories, learned how to juggle and were amazed by magic tricks about science. We even got to be "audacious" with hula hoops! Over 480 children registered for the summer reading program; many of them finished and won prizes, including new books.






