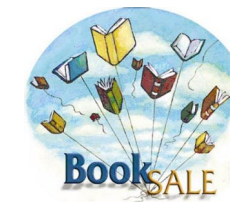

Following opening remarks from President Jean Schuler, the Membership Director, Sandy Luchies, reported that the Friends have a combined membership of 117 individuals. Other business discussed at the meeting included a report from Rosemary Tittle, Director of the Collections / Decorating Committee shared that the committee, which includes Sandy Merkel, Gert Preble, and Bonnie Erber, have worked very hard throughout the year to decorate the Library and to find exhibitors for the display cases.
