Library Wraps Up **Hometown Teams Exhibit**

During December and January, the Fremont Area District Library hosted Hometown Teams: a Smithsonian exhibition made possible by the Michigan Humanities Council, the Smithsonian, and the U.S. Congress. Over 3,000 people walked through the doors of the exhibit and viewed the artifacts on display from the Smithsonian and our local hometowns of Fremont, Grant, Hesperia, White Cloud, and Newaygo.

It was clear from the exhibit that "Our love of sports begins in our hometowns. We play them on ball fields and sandlots, on courts and on ice, in parks and playgrounds, even in the street. From pick-up games to organized leagues, millions of Americans of all ages play sports. Win or lose, we yearn to compete and play another dav."

A full schedule of speakers complimented the exhibit by highlighting everything from Detroit Tigers' baseball to the wondrous beauty of hiking the Great Lakes.


Michigan Notable Author Steve Lehto Preston Tucker and His Battle to Build the **Car of Tomorrow**

At their November Board Meeting, the Friends of the Fremont Area District Library approved funding of \$4,570 for a Wish List presented by the staff of the Library for new books.

During January, a large number of residents took the opportunity to view the 30th annual January Series at The Dogwood Center. The 2017 edition of Calvin College's award-winning January Series featured a wide range of experts leading some of the most pivotal and timely discussions in the nation and the world.

During the noontime series, 15 speakers provided insight into issues like systemic racism in America, the gender gap in technology, healthcare delivery and the cycle of poverty, among many others.
