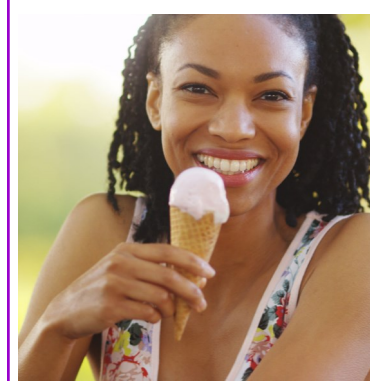

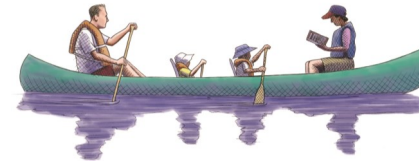

## ADULT SUMMER READING 2016

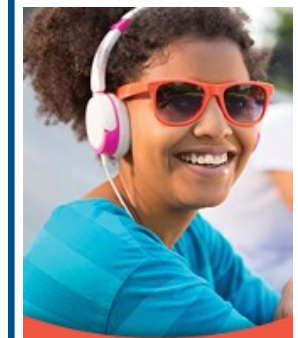


### Guidelines

4. One of your books must be from the "Read" display
5. Return your reading log by August 4th

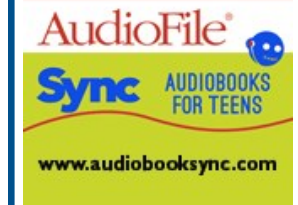

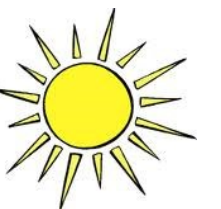
SYNC is a free summer audiobook program for teens.

## Explore Michigan with the Michigan Activity Pass "MAP"



The "Michigan Activity Pass" program is a partnership between more than 400 Michigan public libraries and 100+ arts and cultural organizations. The program is designed to enhance the learning experience for people of all ages through books and other library materials, and to provide reduced cost or complimentary access to arts and cultural organizations across the state of Michigan, from St. Joseph to Saline to Saginaw to Sault Ste. Marie to South Range, and all points in between.

Beginning May 24, library users with a valid library card from any one of Michigan's public libraries can print a pass, either from home or at the library, to one of the 100+ participating cultural institutions at the <http://michiganactivitypass.info> website. Some cultural partners offer complimentary or reduced price admission; others, discounts in their gift shop or other exclusive offers for MAP pass holders only. Each Michigan Activity Pass expires one week from the date it is printed.

### **Air Zoo -- June 14th**

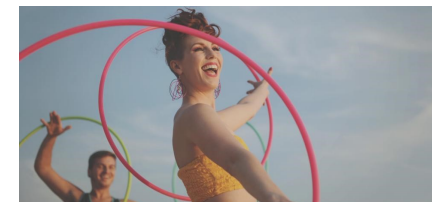
Take an exciting look at animals from around our world in this live presentation.

### **Alex Thomas and Friends -- July 12th**

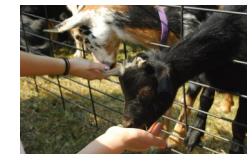
Interactive puppet show! Jokes, prizes, stories, silliness, and all around fun!
