The Friends of the Fremont Area District Library held their annual meeting on Wednesday, May 10, 2017 in the Community Room of the Library. Prior to the start of the meeting, members enjoyed a delicious luncheon prepared by the committee cooks. Table decorations were provided by Marjorie Salata.

Following the Treasurer's Report given by Peg May, the Director of the Library, Ray Arnett, highlighted various items of importance from the year 2016/17. Carolyn Hummell, Director of Book Sales, reported the dates for the sale will be July 19-21. Last year's proceeds were \$4000. At the present time, the Friends have 141 members as reported by Membership Director, Jill Sondeen. Rosemary Tittle will be retiring from Collections and Decorating. Director of the Used Book & Gift Shoppe, Arleen Frost, gave special thanks to Judy Frank and Sandy and Jim Merkel for their many years of devoted service working to sort books and prepare the book sale. Arleen stated that the Friend's Room is short on volunteers, and hours will be evaluated with the possibility of reducing open hours to accommodate the lack of available staffing.

Outreach Director, Gloria Helgemo, thanked 18 readers who read for a half hour per month at the Newaygo County Medical Facility. She also presented the new bookmark for the "Catch 'Em in the Cradle" program. A report was given on the new effort this year to provide books for the January Series at the Dogwood Center by Anne VandeKieft, Director of Public Relations. Forty percent of the books were sold and the Friends look forward to engaging in this new endeavor next year.

Members also elected Board members. The results are as follows: President – Jean Schuler; Vice-President – Mary Thomas; Secretary – Mary Butterick; Treasurer – Peg May. 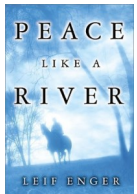
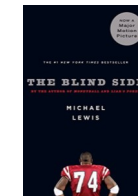


## Wednesday Readers Book Discussion

## Explore Michigan with the Michigan Activity Pass "MAP"



The "Michigan Activity Pass" program is a partnership between more than 400 Michigan public libraries and 100+ arts and cultural organizations. The program encourages Michigan residents to lead healthier lifestyles by offering library cardholders the opportunity to print a free one-day pass, which can be used at 435 participating destinations across the state including any of Michigan's 102 state parks or 138 state forest campgrounds. The program also offers free or discounted admission to 195 historical and cultural destinations in Michigan.

Beginning May 24, library users with a valid library card from any one of Michigan's public libraries can print a pass, either from home or at the library, to one of the state parks, campgrounds, or cultural institutions at the <http://michiganactivitypass.info> website. Some cultural partners offer complimentary or reduced price admission; others, discounts in their gift shop or other exclusive offers for MAP pass holders only. 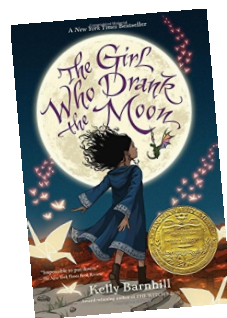

Live animals will be introduced throughout the show as we learn about the rainforest and how to preserve it for a healthy atmosphere.



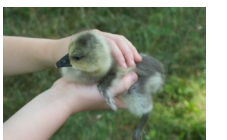
### Jim Merrills: Cup Stacking -- July 11th
