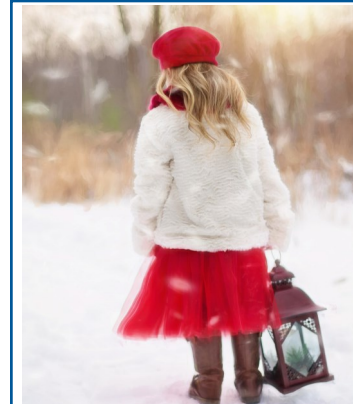

Road to Reading

How "1000 Books Before Kindergarten" Works

- 1 When you enroll your child in 1000 Books Before Kindergarten, you will receive your first Road to Reading chart and folder. For each book you read, write the title on your chart. Don't worry if your child has a favorite book--you can read the same book more than once and have it count each time!
- 2 When you have read 100 books to your child, bring the completed Road to Reading chart back to the library. Share your favorite books with your librarian. Your child will get his or her name on our Wall of Fame, a sticker and a new chart for the next 100 books.
- 3 After every 100 books, be sure to pick up your next Road to Reading chart.
- 4 When your child reaches 1,000 books, he or she will receive his or her very own book to keep, a Road to Reading Certificate of Achievement, and gets a super jumpstart on success in school!

Better Nutrition Every Day
Tips for Eating Out

- Choose foods that are steamed, broiled, baked, roasted, poached, or lightly sautéed or stir-fried.
- Ask for fat-free or low-fat milk instead of cream for coffee or tea.
- Pick food without butter, gravy, or sauces—or ask to have the food without it.
- Choose a low-calorie salad dressing.
- Ask for salad dressing on the side, and use only some of it.
- Pick drinks without added sugar, such as water, fat-free or low-fat milk, unsweetened tea, or diet iced tea, lemonade, or soda.
- Trim visible fat from poultry or meat.
- Don't eat the skin on cooked chicken or turkey.
- Share your meal, or take half home for later.
- Skip dessert or order fruit. Or share dessert with a friend.
