
1. Register for the Summer Reading Program

**SYNC is back this summer with more free audio downloads through Over-Drive! And they're yours to keep!**


**S**YNC is a free summer audiobook program for young adults.

### Wise Choices

#### Is This Website Trustworthy?

Use this checklist to decide if the health information you're reading online can be trusted:



**Who runs the website?** Federal agencies, medical schools, and large professional or nonprofit organizations are often reliable sources of health information.

**Who is sponsoring the website?** Be wary if it's not easy to find the sponsor's contact information or if the website is trying to sell you something.

**Is the information current?** Sites should say when the information was posted or last reviewed.

**Is your privacy protected?** Be sure you understand the website's privacy policy. Be cautious about sharing personal information.

**Does the site make claims that seem too good to be true?** See if you can find other, reliable sites with the same information.

### Explore Michigan with the Michigan Activity Pass "MAP"



The "Michigan Activity Pass" program is a partnership between more than 400 Michigan public libraries and 100+ arts and cultural organizations. The program is designed to enhance the learning experience for people of all ages through books and other library materials, and to provide reduced cost or complimentary access to arts and cultural organizations across the state of Michigan, from St. Joseph to Saline to Saginaw to Sault Ste. Marie to South Range, and all points in between.

Beginning May 24, library users with a valid library card from any one of Michigan's public libraries can print a pass, either from home or at the library, to one of the 100+ participating cultural institutions at the <http://michiganactivitypass.info> website. Some cultural partners offer complimentary or reduced price admission; others, discounts in their gift shop or other exclusive offers for MAP pass holders only. Each Michigan Activity Pass expires one week from the date it is printed.
