The Fremont Area District Library offers an exciting lineup of programs and events throughout April, offering something for everyone—from young children and teens to adults and families. Highlights include Live @ the Library presentations and “Float Your Ideas” for teens and tweens.

Adult Programs & Community Events

- **Homeschooling High School** – Thursday, April 2 at 7:00 p.m. Join experienced homeschool moms Angela Brott and Samantha Kauffman for this presentation designed to help families confidently navigate the high school years at home. They’ll cover state graduation requirements and where to find the most current, reliable information, along with practical tips for creating and maintaining a solid transcript. Attendees will also learn how to prepare students for college applications and explore local opportunities, including classes and extras available through the public school and career tech center.
- **Truth Be Told Book Group** – Tuesday, April 14 at 4:00 p.m., discussing *Fly Girl*.
- **Up North: An Architecture Road Trip Presented by Josha Lipnik** – Thursday, April 16 at 7:00 p.m. Up North: An Architecture Road Trip takes the audience on a tour along the northern coast of Michigan's Lower Peninsula with photographer Josh Lipnik, exploring the architecture and history of Michigan's beloved Up North. This visual slideshow and lecture covers everything from early Victorian resorts to hidden gems of modern architecture, offering new travel destinations for even the most seasoned Michigan traveler.
- **An Evening of Pre-War Blues with musician Nick Veine** – Tuesday, April 21 at 7:00 p.m. An Evening of Pre-War Blues Music is a musical and historical survey of the Blues from the turn of the 20th Century until World War II. It covers the heavy hitters of acoustic blues music from Blind Lemon Jefferson to Charley Patton, Robert Johnson, Muddy Waters and more. This presentation touches on the longstanding tradition of the disenfranchisement of people of African descent, how that mistreatment created the Blues, and the indelible mark left on American Music and Art.
